







Word Wheel


Students of **CP IV** created advertisements using persuasive techniques. It helped the students enhance multiple skills such as: cognitive skills, expression, and voice modulation.

International Connections






Guest Lectures






She was awarded the Nobel Prize in Physics in 2018, together with **Gérard Mourou**, for the practical implementation of chirped pulse amplification.

A session on **Emotional Intelligence** was conducted for teachers by **Mr Dilip Vasu** Principal Choithram School Indore on 5th December.








Opportunities for teachers

Turning adversity into opportunity – Rural school development by **Ms. Neetha Shetty**, Primary Checkpoint Coordinator.



Celebrating Makarsanktranti -IEYC


So what if we can't go out to fly kites? Even the lockdown couldn't dampen the spirit of Makarsankranti as children enjoyed drawing and colouring their kites.
