




ANNUAL INDUCTION PROGRAMME








WHOLE SCHOOL EVENTS







IBDP YEAR 1 SUBJECT ORIENTATION SESSIONS

WORLD LION DAY






CENTA ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAMME

GRANDPARENTS GRANDEUR-A JOURNEY IN TIME







LEARNING CYCLES



So how do we follow through with ethics in the right way?






The learners used Indian currency to understand the concept of money wherein the students participated and understood the valuation and the terms for the currency.




HINDI & HUMANITIES




GEEK-O-PEDIA

AS Assembly - 'OFF ROAD'








Transformative courses and careers of the future




BEHAVIOURIAL COUNSELLING

FUN & FITNESS



Members enthralled us with their wonderful performances, whether it was singing, dancing, cooking, storytelling, or anything else – they had accomplished everything.






PARENT GRATITUDE DAY
