


Fairgaze - Brush Technique for Bamboo Painting

Guest lecture - Adobe Photoshop Workshop

In collaboration with the ICT team, the school conducted a two day workshop on the 3rd and 4th of October with our guest faculty for Media Studies, Mr Shritej Patwardhan on Adobe Photoshop. The workshop educated the IBDP I students with the basic knowledge of designing, manipulating, editing, resizing and reinventing software that allows students to explore design thinking. With technological skills being the need of the hour, the session provided the students with an opportunity to enhance digital learning.



Pre-IG Orientation

In order to help the parents and students make an informed decision for various subjects offered at IGCSE, we had an Orientation on the 19th November, 2022. The parents had an in-depth clarity on the subject choices available and were better placed to choose the subjects.



IB ATL collaboration: The IBDP includes Approaches to Learning Skills (ATLS) as an integral part.

Our IBDP educators gathered to discuss "Approaches to Teaching-Learning." After briefly discussing the skills like thinking, communication, self-management, social, and research, our faculty Ms.Rachana Birju and the DP Coordinator opened the floor for a hands-on training experience. These skills are frequently identified as crucial elements in preparing students for life after school.

After that, each subject group carefully developed a lesson plan while keeping in mind the objectives, strategies, and activities for the evaluation.

For all of the teachers, this was an enlightening session that provided them with knowledge they could use right immediately in their classes.









IB EE 1 Collaboration: Research is an integral part of the IB Diploma Programme. Our faculty member Ms. Soumya Nair led a session on "Overview of Extended Essay" for our faculties as part of the IBDP collaboration session. She outlined the various requirements and components of the extended essay during the session. A special focus was placed on the several policies related to the extended essay, such as the prohibition against animal experimentation, academic honesty, and ethical guidelines. This session was beneficial to all the teachers since it helped them begin to understand how to undertake extended essay research with their students







IB EE 2 Collaboration: ssessment is an inevitable part of education. The unpacking of extended essay assessment criteria started with a Kahoot session to assess the prior knowledge of our IBDP faculties. This fruitful professional development session was conducted by our expert EE coordinators Ms. Soumya Nair and Ms. Rachana Birju by leading in-depth discussion on guiding students in scoring the maximum grades under criteria A: Focus and method. The session was ended with an interesting riddle which gave an insight into the importance of training the mind to think critically. Our faculties participated in the discussions and the activities with great zeal and zest. These sessions will in turn contribute to our learners having an excellent EE experience.





IB EE 3 Collaboration: Our EE coordinators conducted a session for our IBDP faculties on Extended Essay criterion B: Knowledge and understanding. How to create a narrow and more focused RQ was the key element of the session. For more concrete understanding a video on how to design a Research question was played and many examples were shared. The discussions and activities were enthusiastically taken part in by our faculties. Our learners will surely benefit from these sessions by having a great EE experience.

IB SPS Professional Dev: All the IBDP educators in Bunts Sangha's SM Shetty International school and Junior College attended the IB e seminar on Programme Standards and Practices-2020 on the 23rd of November. The whole training was completed in two sessions. The plenary session started with an opening address by Ms. Stefanie Leong, Head of development AP, International Baccalaureate. The session was further lead by Ms. Rima Singh, Head of school, DPS International followed by Ms. Donnah Clempka, Head of school, Ascot International. The sessions highlighted the new addition in PSP -2020, discussed the role of School leaders in leading transformation and also on how to implement the IB programme under the PSP -2020. The breakout session led by the country managers focused on how to apply for candidacy under PSP-2020.



Ms. Hitiksha and Ms. Devanshi: Maslow's Before Blooms. The purpose of the session was to understand that what matters most is what impact have we made on every student every day and whether we are willing to do whatever it takes to inspire them to be more than they ever thought possible. The importance of building relationships with the students goes back to the age old saying that "Kids don't care how much you know until they know how much you care."



Ms. Priya Pasari : Jute Jewellery Today, sustainability is the key focus in education. To make learners more capable of bringing about sustainable change, we must practise reuse of natural resources for transformative learning. The session started with an elaborate demonstration with the basics of making Jute Jewelry, the participants were encouraged to use creative thinking and experiment with new natural resources and create form from their own creative instinct. The participants learnt the ways to make jute jewellery and design their own piece form with careful observation.





Ms. Ishrat Shaikh: Vedic Math
Vedic Math, also known as Vedic
Mathematics, is a set of methods or
sutras for swiftly and efficiently doing
numerical computations. It comprises
16 Sutras known as Formulae and 13
sub-sutras known as Sub Formulae.
The session helped the participants in
mastering Vedic maths which will save
their time and increase motivation in

learning new maths applications. During the session a few tricks of Vedic Math were introduced to the participants. It was a fun learning session.

Ms. Anamika Sharma: Learning to Learn

NEW INITIATIVES - LIFE SKILLS

Organising oneself: Our students went through the basics of organising their school bags & books. This was conducted as the 1st life skill lesson to inculcate a sense of responsibility amongst the students.





Folding clothes: Learning to fold clothes neatly is a useful skill that requires good hand-eye coordination. Moreover it helps organise one's wardrobe/school locker.

NEW INITIATIVES - LIFE SKILLS

Basic First Aid - First aid is the initial treatment given to a victim. The goal of teaching First Aid is to instill a sense of safety in students, not only to raise awareness, but also to prepare them to manage incidents and assess casualties. The more they are aware of the accidents, illnesses, and treatments, the more conscious they become.





Basic Etiquettes - This enables them to form good manners and become more socially attentive as they get older. Practising good social manners not only helps to build lifelong relationships; it also helps create fruitful opportunities from a young age.

Table Manners: It helps children have confidence when dining out during social gatherings.

Healthy Chaat Making Activity: Learning about Nouns in Hindi transformed CP IV classrooms into a fun learning zone wherein students were encouraged to inculcate healthy eating habits as well as explore their culinary skills by making healthy and nutritious Chaat.











CP - Humanities : Students of CP III were asked to make a Ganesha idol out of materials they had at home. This activity not only enhanced their creativity, but it also taught them the importance of the 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle), which are crucial to understand and implement in order to save our planet.







CP - Math: The central idea of active learning is to allow the students to actively engage with content during class that leads to positive learning outcomes. CP I students learned the distinction between 2D and 3D shapes by using clay and forming various shapes out of it. For the children, this was a hands-on experience in which they could relate to the differences between 2D and 3D objects, and also students had a great time creating various 2D and 3D shapes using their own imagination.











CP - Science and PE: To foster a more authentic and purposeful learning environment, two subjects were integrated to make the learning process fun and purposeful. Students from CP I were taken to the school playground to learn how force can change an object's motion and also stop a moving object. To understand the topic, the teachers engaged the students in various activities such as kicking a ball, stopping a ball, and playing various games. This

integration not only made the students play various games, but it also helped them in learning various Science concepts.

CP I students conducted an activity on forces that can change the shape of an object using clay. This hands-on activity helped students learn not only how to shape the clay in different ways, but also to learn about forces in a fun way.

Students of CP II brought the necessary materials to the classroom and created various puppets. The students then observed the






various shadows cast by these puppets.




CHILD HEALTH DAY




